Pro-enforcement

However, not all communities experiencing student-police tensions are so eager to spend time talking; some just

Gregg Lobisser, University associate dean of students, recently returned from a conference of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators where he attended a seminar on university-community relations at the University of Delaware, Newark.

Lobisser said that Newark had experienced many community relations problems because the student population is close to the size of the city's.

To relieve mounting tensions, the university and community agreed on a pro-enforcement stance. The city passed ordinances broadening the definition of noise and or-

dering landlords to evict tenants with more than two noise violations.

Moreover, the University of Delaware, Newark, decided to suspend students with more than three noise or consumption misdemeanors and to expel any student with three felonies or more than four misde-

Lobisser said the school's officials provided evidence that their policies are legal. "They cited a couple of cases that went to the Supreme Court." he said. "It found that there is no double jeopardy" in subjecting students to both civic and academic penalties.


But Lobisser said students shouldn't worry that such policies would be adopted in Eu-
