Life on the road in 1990 has been less than kind at times to the Ducks, ranked 10th in the nation after falling from fifth to 20th.

Oregon played no fewer than 14 games against top-20 teams. including a double header split with No. 1 UCLA two weeks ago. That, combined with lack of early-season practice, has hurt the Ducks most, Brown said.

"Not being able to practice outside early on and playing so many ranked teams early on hasn't helped." she said. "We played the No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 teams in the nation already. Everybody we play is really ready for us after what this **Oregon Daily Emerald**
