ture of Oelke, noting one match where a number of Oelke's friends came by to cheer him on during a match at home.

"He's top notch. He's very friendly, and he has a lot of good friends. In fact I saw maybe ten of his buddies there to watch him (at a match last term)," Summers said. "He's very amiable, a gregarious type of kid."

Oelke is one of many young players on the tennis team this year. Summers recognized freshmen Rob Atkin and Kevin Settlemyre as well as Thoren as three other young players who are holding strong on the squad.

"I'd say of all our freshman, Oelke's probably the better athlete. His size limits what he can do. But as far as overall athletic ability, I think he's probably a bit better," Summers said.

Summers was impressed with Oelke's natural ability, something that is not learned or coached.

"He has a lot of natural ability. He's one of the better athletes on the team," Summers said. "He doesn't have the size that some have, but he's able to move and has got good hand-eye coordination. He's got some natural talents that some others don't have."

Oregon golfer Cam Martin had a three-day score of 217 to take second place individually in the Western Intercollegiate men's golf tournament in Santa Cruz, Calif.

Martin's score helped lead the Ducks to a second place finish as a team, just six strokes behind tournament champion Fresno State. UNLV and Brigham Young finished 3-4 in the 54-hole tourney, followed by a fifth-place tie between San Jose State and UCLA.

Mike Foster of San Jose State came from three shots back in the third day of competition to move from eighth in the second day to the tournament championship with a three-day total of 216.

Martin, Per Nyman of Fresno State and Monte Montgomery of UNLV were locked in a three-way tie for first after two days, just one shot ahead of Terrence Miskell of Fresno State and Richard Beam of New Mexico State.

Chris Holzgang of Oregon finished in a five-way tie for fourth place just two shots off the lead at 218. Holzgang moved from an eighth-place tie in the second day of competition to fourth by shooting a 72 on the third day.

Tim Hval of Oregon shot a three-day total of 221, good enough for 11th place in the tourney. Hval moved from a tie for 28th in the second day to 11th by shooting a 71 on the third day.

Tom Smith and Bob Rannow,

both of Oregon, shot 230 for the tournament, good enough for a tie for 61st in the competitive tourney.

Oregon travels to Phoenix Arizona for the Sun Devil Thunderbird Classic April 19-21 before the Pacific-10 championships at Stanford April 27-29.

Women

Oregon's Nancy Crawford shot a 234 in the three-day Arizona

State University Lady Sun Devil golf tournament, good for 33rd, to highlight the Oregon women golf team's disappointing 16th place finish.

Host Arizona State's Gold team won the tournament, which ended Wednesday, with a three-day total score of 882. Arizona was second at 899 followed by San Jose State, Tulsa and Oklahoma State rounding out the top five finishers.

Singles players lead men by Willamette

The Oregon men's tennis team swept through six singles matches and won two of three doubles matches to take an easy 8-1 win Tuesday over Willamette in Salem.

All six singles wins came in straight sets. Ted Thoren, Oregon's fifth singles man had the toughest time, taking care of Andrew Shipman 6-4, 7-5. Outside of Shipman, no Willamette player won more than five games.

Kevin Cory led off singles, taking Kelly Tuttle 6-3, 6-2. Australian James Hazard followed for the Ducks with an easy 6-1, 6-2 win over David Jerke.

Oregon's third singles man, Ted Rubin took a quiet 6-0, 6-3 win over John Lovell to make it

3-0. Oregon. Rob Atkin followed with a 6-0, 6-3 win over Rick Wood.

Christian Oelke took care of Swain Porter 6-2, 6-1 and Doug Root of Oregon finished up singles play by disposing of Adrian Chin by a 6-1, 6-1 score.

Tuttle and Jerke took Willamette's only win of the match by defeating Hazard and Rubin 7-5, 4-6, 6-3 in doubles play. Kevin Settlemyre and Atkin won in the second doubles match over Wood and Shipman by a 6-4, 6-3 score.

Oelke and Thoren wound things up for Oregon, taking a 4-6, 6-2, 6-4 win over Lovell and Porter.

Oregon improved its record to 9-13 with four matches remaining. The Ducks host Azusa Pacific today at 2:30 p.m.

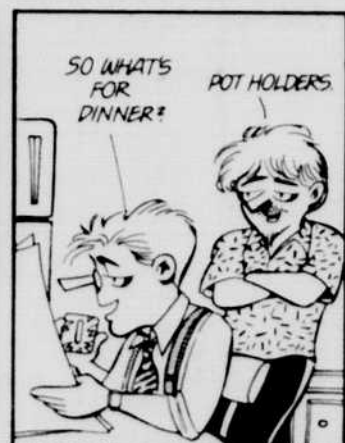
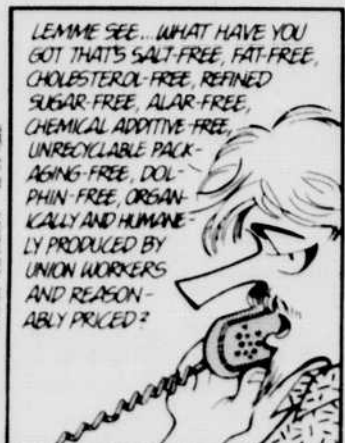
