"The Career Planning and Placement Office is failing to fulfill its affirmative action policies," said Shannon Oliver, a student activist who addressed the Senate. "The issue at hand is sexual orientation. No laws protect gay men and lesbians."

CIA recruiting on campus led to the initial drafting of a motion calling for organizations being required to sign statements, said Student Senator Brian Hoop, who presented the motion to the Senate.

When the issue came up before the Student Senate in the fall, it decided to include all recruiters and not just the CIA, Hoop said.

"This motion prohibits the University from providing facilities for companies and organizations that do not sign," Hoop said.

The motion now passes on to the University Assembly for approval.

In another action, the Senate voted to recommend the University recognize Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday as a holiday.

President Brand addressed the Senate saying when he first came to campus he was dismayed that there was no Martin Luther King day.

Brand said he found out that the University president could put recognition of Martin Luther King day in the University's constitution himself, but he did not think it would be right. He has already discussed the matter with the Faculty Advising Committee, which gave its approval.

Academic and cultural activities that focus on the importance and value of diversity will be held during the day, Brand said in a letter to the Senate.

"Even though it is a holiday, most of the campus will be active," Brand said.

Both the registrar's office and the Law School have also given their approval, he said.

Brand will next bring up the issue to the Council of Deans. Should they approve it, he will designate the closest Monday to Jan. 15 (King's Birthday) Martin Luther King Day.
