Three teams joining Ducks for invitational

Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, Georgetown and Washington State make their way to Hayward Field Saturday to compete against the Oregon women's track team in the Pepsi Team Invitational.

The Cougars return to Oregon just one week after a 22-point loss to the Ducks at Hayward Field last Saturday.

Cal Poly-SLO, the reigning women's NCAA Division II national champions, have faced the Ducks twice in the past going down to defeat each time. Oregon did meet with the Broncos earlier this season at a non-scoring contest in Berkeley, Calif.

The Ducks match up against Georgetown for the first time in a team-scoring situation.

Oregon's Liz Wilson has already achieved the provisional NCAA standards in the 1,500 and 3,000, and the senior will look to add a qualifying mark in her first attempt of the season in the 5,000.

The 5,000 is shaping up to be one of the more exciting events of the meet. Wilson will have to fend off last year's Pacific 10 Conference champion in the distance, Jennifer Robertson of WSU, as well as freshman Christi Constantin of Georgetown.

Kim Hyatt and Paula Berry have good chances to finish 1-2 in the javelin. Hyatt has yet to
