of Illinois, where she has a scholarship to play on their wheelchair basketball team.

After 27 surgeries and much rehabilitation, Tozer is now able to walk short distances. She hopes to be able to get around without her wheelchair eventually, but she will always need it for sports.

For the Low Riders, the game will be business as usual, but for the Ducks it will quite a challenge.

The Ducks will be playing the game of basketball with a whole new set of rules. In wheelchair basketball, players must dribble the ball once, put it in their laps and then give the chairs two pushes.

Any more than two pushes will draw a traveling foul. Each player is allowed five seconds in the key before he/she must shoot the ball.

"I think it's going to be playing from a different perspective," said Duck center Richard Lucas.

"(Guard) Keith Mixon asked if 3-pointers were allowed, but what are the chances of him

having the arm strength to make a 3-pointer from that far away while he's sitting down?" Lucas asked.

Both Lucas and forward Keith Reynolds said that they were a little nervous about playing basketball in wheelchairs, but they were not going to worry too much about it.

"Hopefully we'll put up a good game, but if we don't, let's just go out there and have fun," said Reynolds, who will be playing his last game in McArthur Court.

"We want everyone to have a good time," Tozer said. "If you like sports, you'll enjoy this game and it will give people an idea of what disabled people are capable of."

The other unique aspect of wheelchair basketball is that "no one on our team has a jump shot," Tozer said.

Tickets are \$2 in advance and \$2.50 at the door. They are available at the EMU Main Desk, the ASUO Office (Suite 4 EMU), the University Athletic Ticket Office and the Volunteer Office at Sacred Heart Hospital.

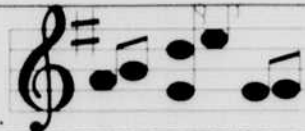

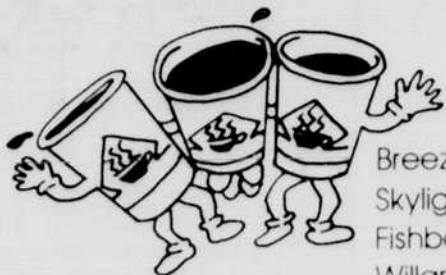
