"She's not really overpowering," Brown said of Jones, who sports an ERA of under 0.50. "What she is is very smart. She keeps the ball low and has great control."

Arizona jumped on Oregon early in the second game, taking a 1-0 lead in the first inning after Jones singled to center to score Vivian Holm, who led off the inning with a double to right field.

Arizona made it 3-0 in the fourth when Kristin Guathier's infield hit brought Jody Miller and Stander home.

Ginnie Sheller scattered six hits to get the win for Arizona and raise her record to 11-2 this season. With the two losses, Wiese dropped to 15-10.

"This has been a great trip," said Andrea, whose Wildcats also swept Oregon State Friday. "We've put ourselves in a position to control our own destiny and that's all you can ask this time of year."

Oregon hosts Portland State Saturday and No. 1 ranked UCLA Saturday.

"I thought we kept after them all during the meet, and we got key performances when we needed them," Heinonen said.

Heinonen noted Mary Anderson's effort in the triple jump. The freshman from Roseburg had been bothered with bad shins and was only probable to compete. Assistant coach Mark Stream made the decision to use her — a decision he should be more than happy with.

Anderson jumped 37-6 to take third place. That mark beat her personal record by five inches and it tops any leap she

has made this year by close to two feet, Heinonen said.

Kamala Kohlmeier put out her usual nothing-but-effort performance. Kohlmeier opened her competition with a third in the long jump.

Later on, Kohlmeier rattled half of the hurdles in the 100 meter hurdles but still managed to tie both her personal record (14.12) and the race favorite, Sharon Polley of Cal Poly.

Kim Hyatt and Paula Berry once again finished 1-2 in the javelin. Hyatt narrowly edged Berry's mark of 168-0 with a toss of 168-9.

Freshman Kelly Blair gave teammate Laurel Roberts a surprise of her own in the high jump. Blair used her best jump of the year (5-9 3/4) to defeat the favored Roberts who finished second with a leap of 5-8 3/4.

Rosie Williams helped the 4x100 relay team to victory early in the meet, but the junior sprinter had to pull up near the end of her win in the 100 due to a strained hamstring.

Williams, who won the race with an 11.81 time, had to pass on the 200 and 4x400. She is questionable for next week.
