# Club Hockey plays for league title

A first-place finish in the "A" league of the Lane Amateur Hockey Association will be at stake tonight at 7 p.m. for the Club Sports hockey team when the Ducks take on OSU/Corvallis at Lane County Ice.

Oregon is tied with the Eugene Blades at 7-3-1 with only



the OSU game remaining on the regular schedule. Oregon is 1-2-1 against the Blades this season.

The Ducks pounded OSU 19-0 in the teams' only meeting of the year. The Blades may have a rougher time of it as they meet the Jets from Portland. If Oregon wins and the Blades lose, the Ducks will be league champions. If both the Ducks and Blades win, the teams will finish in a tie and a play-off game will be scheduled to decide the league champion.

Admission to the game at the Lane County Fairgrounds is free.

### Club Cycling

The Oregon men's Club Cy-

cling team swept the top three positions Saturday in the 50-minute criterium event in a Corvallis meet. Cyclists from OSU, Washington and Oregon participated.

Brad Gebhard, Matt Fletcher and Steve Marcy finished 1-2-3 for the Ducks followed by Bill Randleman and Will Hall at fifth and ninth, respectively.

Other Oregon finishers were Paul Schierholtz (12th), Rob Blair (13th) and Peter Courogen (17th).

Jennifer Vendetti was the highest women's finisher with a third place showing, followed by Cindy Israel at fourth and Trina Allen at ninth.

The Ducks then traveled to Portland for a meet against Oregon State on Sunday.

Courogen rebounded from his 17th place finish the day before to take first. Courogen, one of the top triathletes on the West Coast, broke away early with Hall to take the win. Hall finished fourth. Guy Jeffress and Blair finished sixth and ninth, respectively.

On the women's side, Israel and Vendette finished first and second, respectively, for the Ducks.

The Ducks have a meet this Saturday at Lowell and host their own criterium race Sunday.

### Club Lacrosse

Andrew Clonsky and John Clerenbach scored four goals apiece to lead the Oregon Club Sports Lacrosse team to an easy

17-4 win over Eugene Men's Lacrosse Club Saturday at Eugene's Monroe Middle School.

Oregon took an early lead and led wire-to-wire for the win.

Carl White filled in at goalie for Rob Toni and held the Eugene club to four goals.

Oregon hosts the University of Puget Sound Saturday at Southbank Field.

### Club Crew

Oregon Club crew teams took a total of six first place finishes Sunday in the Covered Bridge Regatta in Dexter Reservoir.

The Women's light-weight-4 team started things off, taking first by less than three seconds over a team from Humboldt State University. A second Oregon team took third in the event.

Oregon was first in the women's novice-8 event by less than five seconds over Humboldt. Oregon women also grabbed first in the women's novice-4 event by a wide margin.

The men took their first win in the open-8 event while two separate Humboldt teams took second and third. The Duck men also grabbed first in the men's open-4, just barely two seconds ahead of Humboldt.

The Club Crew team will take part in the Portland/Vancouver Regatta this Saturday at Vancouver Lake in Washington State.

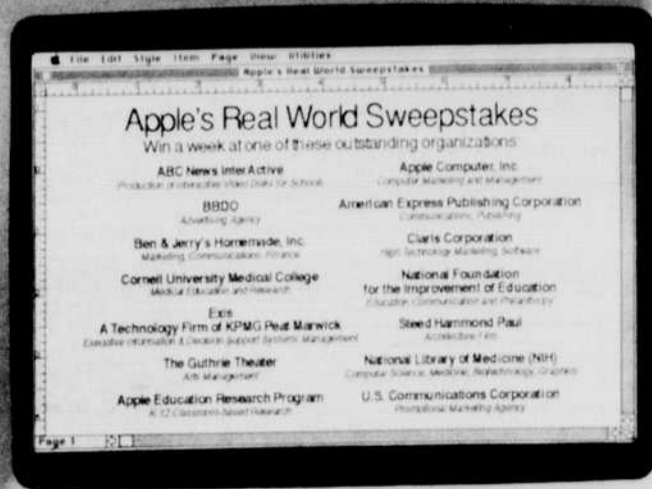
