

# Businesses earn Earth Day awards

The Eugene Earth Day Business Committee presented awards to four local businesses and recognized nine others Thursday for their outstanding environmental performance.

The businesses were evaluated in areas including transportation, recycling, energy efficiency, and toxins and pollutants.

The awards were based on nominations from individuals in the business community. Norma Grier, chair of the local Earth Day Business Committee, said the nominations were primarily triggered by a Workplace Environmental Assessment circulated by the committee as an educational tool.

Grier presented an award to Burley Design Cooperative for its efforts to increase the utility and usage of bicycles for transportation.

BRING Recycling received a performance

award for sustained success in its recycling program. Bruce Philbrick, BRING's general manager, thanked the committee for its recognition of the program's work in reduction, reuse, and recycling and said BRING looks forward to the "continued celebration of Earth Day every day."

Sage Advance Corporation was honored for its contributions to energy efficiency by manufacturing a "copper cricket," a solar hot water heater with no moving parts that is designed to operate perpetually.

Organically Grown Cooperative received an award for its work in distributing its fruits and vegetables in Oregon.

Other businesses recognized for their environmental contributions included the City of Eugene, Earl's Sanitary Service, Emerald People's Utility District, Emporium Department Stores, Eugene School District 4J, Northwest IPM, Pearl Buck Recycling, Sacred Heart Hospital, and Selco Credit Union.
