Two women's softball games this weekend

The Oregon women's softball team continues its late-season home stand this weekend with a non-conference double-header with Portland State Saturday and a Pac-10 twin bill with No. 1 UCLA Sunday.

Game one with the Vikings begins at 1 p.m. and the meeting with UCLA begins at noon.

The women are coming off a double-header sweep of Portland State last Sunday. Oregon won the first game 1-0 and blew the Vikings out 6-0 in the second game.

Oregon lost a pair of 3-0 decisions on Oregon's Howe Field last Saturday to the third-ranked Arizona Wildcats.

UCLA, leading the Pac-10 with an 11-1 league mark, swept Arizona Wednesday, 5-0 in the first game, 2-0 in the second. It marked the first time in eight games any team had scored on the Wildcats.

The Bruins' only loss in the conference this season came against the Ducks on March 27. UCLA is 3-1 overall against Oregon this season.

Oregon is 2-8 in the Pac-10, 23-19 overall.

Injury-cursed Ducks face Bears Saturday

Suffering from injuries and illness, the Oregon men's track team limps into California's Edwards Stadium hoping to have enough left to overcome California in Saturday's dual meet.

With Klaus Weigeldt (hamstring) and Jimmy Howarth (chicken pox) out until at least the Nebraska dual meet in two weeks, and with injuries limiting the effectiveness of Latin Berry and Spencer Williams, Saturday's meet suddenly becomes a lot closer than last year's 128-35 Duck win.

However, Oregon coach Bill Dellinger said the Ducks' strength in the distance events

should be enough to overcome the injuries and the Golden Bears.

"It's going to be fairly close and no one is going to run away with it," Dellinger said. "For them to win they have to break us up in the distance events and their guy probably has to win the 1,500."

Berry, still suffering from a bruised heel, will "definitely long jump," Dellinger said, but may not triple jump. Williams took only one jump last week in the triple jump and Dellinger said he won't know until the last minute if Williams will be able to compete.

That could mean some big points for Cal in the long jump and triple jump where the Golden Bears are particularly strong anyway.

Mike Harris, the defending Pacific-10 Conference champ in the triple jump, has a best of 53-4½ this season while teammates Harold Tucker and Joe Frank have gone 52-11 and 51-3, respectively. If Berry and Williams are unable to go in the triple jump, Oregon's best hope will lie with Johnny Taylor who won the event at last
