# Women's team to take on Bears

The Oregon women's track team returns to Berkeley, Calif. Saturday to take on California and New Mexico, but this time the scores count.

The Ducks traveled south last month to compete in the Golden Bear Meet of Champions, a non-scoring affair.

Oregon has defeated the Golden Bears in all seven of their previous meetings, with last year's 88-48 triumph breaking the Ducks' string of five straight 90-point outings. Oregon and New Mexico have never met in team-scoring competition.

Oregon's Rosie Williams, last year's Pacific 10 Conference 200 champion, may not be able to perform in her specialties Saturday. After pulling up in the 100 with a strained hamstring in last week's Pepsi Team Invitational, Williams is still questionable for the 100 and 200.

With Williams in doubt, Cal's Mina Hutchins (11:90) and Joslyn Mack (11:80) may grab a 1-2 sweep in the 100.

Kamala Kohlmeier and Kelly Blair are looking to qualify for the Pac-10 meet in the long jump. They will face two of the league's best jumpers in Cal's Sheila Hudson and Mona Simmons. Hudson owns the year's best conference mark of 21-9½ followed by Simmons' 20-7¼.

Simmons has also qualified for the Pac-10s in the 200 with

a time of 24.2. Again, the Ducks could really suffer without Williams in the lineup.

Cal's Crissy Cerkel has qualified for the Pac-10 meet in both the long jump and triple jump with marks of 19-10¼ and 38-3½. Kohlmeier's best leap is 19-0¼ wind aided, while Blair has a top leap of 18-2 (wind aided) this year.

Kim Hyatt and Paula Berry possess the second and third best throws in the nation for Oregon, but both are still in search of the NCAA qualifying standard of 173-11. Hyatt has a toss of 169-8, while Berry's best effort on the year is 168-4.

Cal is strong in the distances as being well-led by Sabrina Hand, owner of the league's fastest 1,500 time (4:23.2) and second fastest 5,000 mark (16:37.7) prior to last week's competition. Teammate Tracey Williams has qualified for the Pac-10s in the 1,500 with a

time of 4:26.32.

Oregon's Liz Wilson and Stephanie Wessell hope to better Cal's distance runners, and if previous meets this year are any indication they should do just that.

Wessell, who defeated Wilson in the 5,000 last week with a time of 16:26.00, will run the 1,500 Saturday. Her best time of the year in the event (4:33.2) came against the Bears in the earlier meet.

The 4x100 relay brought in a school record last week for Cal. The 4x400 squad for Cal blew Oregon away by five seconds in the earlier meeting.

"Cal is a good team, and they match up really well against us," Oregon coach Tom Heinonen said. "They're good in the sprints, the horizontal jumps, and the hurdles."

"We've got to exploit them in the throws, and we're better than they are in the distances."

weekend's Pepsi Team Invitational with a wind-aided jump of 50-5¼.

Cal also has a lot of strength in the long jump with Curtis Rogers and Kevin Smith. Rogers has an indoor best of 26-2¼ this season while Smith has leaped 25-2¼. Oregon freshman Ron Foster, who won the long jump at the Pepsi meet, made the traveling team to give the Ducks more depth there.

With Weigeldt out of the 400-meter relay, decathlete Pedro daSilva will take his place in the short relay and also compete in high hurdles and javelin.


One of the premiere performers in the meet will be Cal sprinter Alee Maborn, who redshirted a year ago.

Maborn competed in the 1988 Olympics for Canada and has clocked 10:36 in the 100 meters this season and a time of 20:90 in the 200.


The Ducks are expected to win the meet in the distance events with Danny Lopez, Pat Haller and Dustin Welch dueling with Cal's Reggie Williams in the 1,500 meters. Dellinger is also expecting a 1-2 sweep in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with Rick Mestler and Tye Van Schoiack.

The men's portion of the meet begins at 12:30 p.m. with the hammer throw. The meet will be aired on a tape-delay basis on ESPN Wednesday night.
