Job Search, put together by the University's Career Planning and Placement Center, lists the most common reasons for rejection employers normally give for turning down candidates. - · inability to express themselves clearly, poor voice, diction and grammar
- · failure to participate in student activities
- · lack of interest and enthusiasm; passive or indif-

- · makes excuses, is evasive and hedges about unfavorable factors in work
- · lack of knowledge of the employer with whom the candidate is interviewing
- · poor scholastic record · late for the interview
- · sloppy data sheet, re-

- the interview · indecisive, lacks initiative
- · indefinite responses to questions; talks too much
- · asks no questions about the job
- · extreme nervousness
