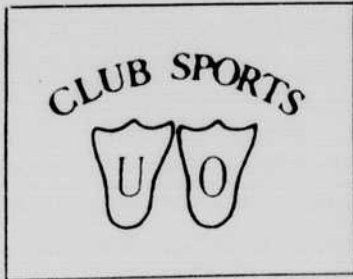


Oregon hockey team clinches first place title

Volleyball team is fifth in nation

Michael Rousell scored three goals while Ron Kellett added two goals and an assist last Wednesday to lead the University Club Sports hockey team to a first-place-clinching 8-3 win over OSU/Corvallis in Lane Amateur Hockey Association play.

Oregon's win, combined



with the Eugene Blades' 8-4 loss to Portland International Air Academy, gave the Ducks an 8-4-1 record and sole possession of first place in the LAHA 'A' division standings. The Blades finished 7-5-1, two points behind the Ducks.

Kellett assisted on Rousell's first goal, which came at 8:26 of the first period and gave the Ducks a 1-1 tie. Corvallis had taken a 1-0 lead on Mike Gaczewski's goal at the 13-minute mark.

Rousell lit the lamp again at the 8:10 mark to make it 2-1, Oregon. Kellett scored off an assist from Glenn Mitchell at 4:43 and Kurt Giesler scored unassisted at 2:31 of the first period as Oregon went to first intermission with a 4-1 lead.

Oregon made it 6-2 after two periods when Blaise Cacciola scored on an assist from Giesler at the 11:14 mark of the second period. Kellett scored his second goal on Dan Baker's assist at the 3:11 mark. James Lowenstein scored for Corvallis at 7:02.

Ned White scored on an assist from Charles Goldade at

4:39 of the third period and Rousell finished his hat trick with 1:10 left to finish scoring for the Ducks. Tom Scudder scored for Corvallis at the 4:48 mark.

With a successful season behind it, Club Sports hockey is looking to next year's expanded schedule, which includes inter-state play. Oregon will be moving into the 1990-91 year with just six returning players and no coach, team spokesman Scott Brown said.

Club Cycling

Oregon Club Cycling finished a busy weekend Sunday, taking third in last weekend's competition at Lowell Park and the University campus. Oregon State was first, followed by Washington State and the Ducks.

The Ducks enter this weekend's regional championships in Washington's Tri-City area needing to pull into first or second place in team standings to qualify for the National Championships in Palo Alto, Calif.

In Saturday's road race at Lowell, the men took three of the top five positions in the 65-mile race. Bill Randleman, John Browning and Will Hall took first, second and fifth, respectively, to lead the men to the team win.

Other Oregon finishers were Brad Gebhard at seventh, Steve Marcy at eighth, Mark Landry at 12th, Matt Fletcher at 14th and Dan Kling at 16th.

The women finished fourth with Jennifer Vendetti leading Oregon at eighth. Vendetti and Cindy Israel were involved in a crash during the race. Vendetti finished the race, but Israel couldn't go on. Her status for this weekend's race is questionable.

Trina Allen finished 11th for the Ducks, who finished fourth

as a team in the five-team competition.

At the 9.5-mile team trial, the team of Randleman, Gebhard, Marcy, Hall and Peter Courogen took first, 14 seconds ahead of Oregon State.

The Ducks hosted the University of Oregon Criterium race Sunday, with the men taking second and the women fourth in the event.

Marcy topped Duck finishers at seventh followed by Courogen at eighth, Randleman at 10th, Hall at 11th and Gebhard at 12th. Gebhard and Hall both overcame falls to finish the race.

Vendetti came back from her crash the day before to take fourth in the race. Stephanie Deutschman was eighth for Oregon.

Club Cycling member Krishna Muirhead took fourth in the Sport Category Sunday in Peak Sports Mud Slinger mountain bike race in Corvallis.

Club Volleyball

The Club Volleyball team took fifth in the nation at the Collegiate Club Nationals last Saturday and Sunday in Knoxville, Tenn. There were 40 teams participating from 23 different states.

The Ducks lost in the quarterfinals to eventual champion Cal-Berkeley. Oregon beat teams from University of Buffalo (N.Y.), Iowa State, North Carolina State, Yale and Air Force Academy.

Club Lacrosse

Rob Haggerty scored five goals and had three assists in the Club Lacrosse teams' two wins here last weekend. Oregon beat University of Puget Sound 11-9 Saturday and blew past Pacific Lutheran 13-9 Sunday.

Haggerty led the Ducks with three goals and Pete Adamson

and John Clarenbach each added two in the Puget Sound game. The game was tied 3-3 after one quarter and 7-7 at the half.

Rob English had a goal and a team-high four assists to go with Haggerty's two goals and two assists against over-matched Pacific Lutheran. Tom Johnston had three goals while Clarenbach and Joel Holland had two apiece.

Club Soccer

Oregon Club Soccer took two wins against two losses to take third place in a four-team tournament in Corvallis last Saturday.

Sam Maccarrone had two goals and Horace Harrison and Robert Halstead added one each to lead the team to a 4-1

win over L.W.O. Corporation in the first game of the tournament. Oregon lost the next two, 3-0 to Portland Club and 5-1 to Peacock Club, before beating L.W.O. again, 2-0. Maccarrone and Wes Cedros scored the goals for Oregon.

Women's Club Soccer ran its record to a perfect 5-0 Monday with a 4-1 win over Player's A. Lisa Arnold, Cindy Cahill, Debbie McMinds and Jody Kaulukukui each had single goals for the Ducks.

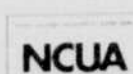

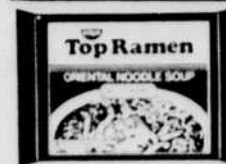
