## Two more Ducks drafted in NFL

Two more Oregon players were selected in the National Football League draft on Monday as Curt Dykes went in the eighth round and Daryl Reed was picked in the 11th round.

Dykes became the 217th pick overall when the senior offensive tackle was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles, Reed, a senior cornerback, was chosen 286th overall when he was tabbed by the Seattle Seahawks.

Monday's selections gave Oregon four players drafted after Latin Berry and Chris Oldham were picked on Sunday in the third and fourth rounds, respectively.

At 6-foot-4 and 280 pounds. Dykes was an integral part of the Oregon offense the past two seasons after transferring from Palomar Junior College in California. Dykes was a two-year starter at tackle and started all 24 games the Ducks played in

that time span. He was also considered the Ducks' top offensive lineman each of the last two seasons.

Reed started 11 of Oregon's 12 games at cornerback and gave the Ducks one of the best corner combinations in the Pacific-10 Conference last season with Oldham. Reed intercepted two passes in his career, with one in each of his last two seasons. A 6-1, 192-pound native of Los Angeles, Reed started one game his junior season, but he saw a lot of playing time in Oregon's six defensive back package in passing situations.

Noticeably absent from the draft was Oregon tailback Derek Loville.

Loville was the Ducks' alltime leading rusher and scorer and was the only player in school history to lead the team in rushing for four years.

Wide receiver Terry Obee was also expected to go in the two-day draft but like Loville was not picked. Obee is the Pac-10's all-time leader in punt

returns and punt return yardage. He also finished as Oregon's all-time leader in career receiving yardage

This year's draft was the first time since 1976 that as many as four Oregon players were drafted. The 1976 draft took five players who had competed for the Ducks.

The Oregon women's tennis team won two of its three matches up north over the weekend to improve its season record to 14-11.

The Ducks beat Washington State 7-2 and Idaho 6-3 on Friday before losing to Washington Saturday by a 9-0 score.

Kumi Nagamoto, Oregon's all-time leader in career singles victories, won only one of three matches, but she played well in the two matches she did lose.

Nagamoto beat Nancy Lagins of Washington State Friday before falling in three sets to Idaho's Patricia Shanander. On Saturday Nagamoto extended Washington's Cindy Olejar to three sets before falling 3-6. 6-3, 6-0.

Oregon's top doubles team of Nagamoto and Amber Goheen also went to three sets before losing to Olejar and Mary Reilly by a 3-6, 6-0, 6-3 count.

Hilary Roberts, the Ducks' No. 2 singles player, also went to three sets before losing to Reilly 6-2, 0-6, 6-3

In other action, the Huskies won in straight sets in third. fourth, fifth and sixth singles and in the second and third doubles slots



At No. 3 singles Kris Clevenger topped Goheen 6-1, 6-1 while Shelley Brandt lost in the fourth singles slot to Kristen Hudson 6-3, 7-5. The Ducks' No. 5 singles player, Margaret Fraleigh fell to Becky Clayton 6-3, 6-1 while teammate Jackie DeFord was beaten 6-2, 6-0 in No. 6 singles by Liz

In other doubles action, Roberts and Brandt lost at second doubles to Clevenger-Clayton by a 6-3, 6-4 count and Fraleigh and DeFord were beaten at No. 3 doubles by Hudson-Lisa Hinckley, 6-0, 6-2.
