to keep doing studies on drug affects on animals. Maybe not salmon again, but I would like to go into that area.

It's been a long road for Nagamoto, though, to get where she is today.

Wanting to do something dif ferent than her high school friends in Yamato, Nagamoto decided to come to the United States when her father suggested it.

"First of all it's real easy to go a university in Japan if you come from a big, private high school." Nagamoto said. "You could easily go there and get into the university without taking really hard (entrance) exams. Everyone was doing that, but I didn't want to do that.

'I wanted to learn English and experience American tennis," she said. "My father came to Oregon on business and he met some people that could take care of me. He said to write to them and see if they wanted to be my host family. I

said 'OK, I'll write,' and they decided to be my host family in Portland.

Having graduated from high school in March. Nagamoto enrolled at Lewis & Clark College during spring term in 1986 to take English courses before enrolling in Oregon at the start of fall term, 1986

Looking back, Nagamoto said she didn't know what to expect when she came to Eugene.

"I was really scared because I had been living with my host family and they were a Japanese-American family," she said, "and then my first roommate here was a big Caucasian

Having tennis was a big help in getting acclimated to American life. Nagamoto said

'Since we started tennis practice in the fall. I was able to learn a lot of English and pick up a lot of slang," she

Nagamoto didn't have any problem adjusting to Pacific-10

tennis her freshman year. As the Ducks' No. 3 singles player, she posted an 18-3 record and was named the Pac-10's Northern Division co-Most Valuable Player

"I didn't know what kind of level of play there was here." Nagamoto said. "I heard Oregon was a Pac-10 school, but I didn't have any idea what the level of play would be like. I just did my best."

During her sophomore year Nagamoto stepped up her play, moving to No. 1 singles and again winning the Northern Division co-MVP award with a 17-5 singles record and a 22-3 doubles record with Cindy Grall.

Oregon played a tougher schedule last year in Greider's first year as coach. Nagamoto's singles record dipped to 12-6 and she was again named to the all-Northern Division, but not the division's MVP. Still, it would be hard for Nagamoto to call last season a disappoint-

In fact. Nagamoto, mostly a baseline player, believed she played better last year than the first two years largely because of Greider, who holds Oregon's men's singles records for victories in a season and career, and who took over for Sue Jacobson, the team's coach during Nagamoto's first two years.

"I guess I sort of needed an adjustment." she said. "Tom is a real skillful coach and knows a lot more about the little, technical things. Sue was a good manager but Tom is a good coach.

"He reminded me of the things I had learned, but had forgotten." Nagamoto said of Greider

But Greider refuses to take credit for the improvement in Nagamoto's game

"I don't take the credit because I don't deserve the credit." Greider said. "My job is to keep the team happy. She did all of the work, not me.

Past AD dies

Leo Harris, the first Di rector of Athletics for the University of Oregon and the man regarded as the main force behind the construction of Autzen Stadium, died at his home in Monterey, Calif., Sunday following a short illness

Harris, 85, left his position as superintendent of schools in Carmel, Calif., to oversee Oregon's athletic department in 1947.

In addition to Autzen Stadium, Harris initiated improvements to McArthur Court and Hayward Field. He was also responsible for the hiring of such notable Oregon coaches as Len Casanova and Bill Bowerman. He also held prestigious positions on various NCAA committees such as the organization's first television committee.


