

IFC denies reallocation requests

The Incidental Fee Committee refused to budge Thursday on its original allocations for EMU programs and on a proposed office addition for Club Sports.

At a meeting earlier this year, the IFC allocated \$591,461 to EMU programs, a 2.2 percent increase over the previous year's budget.

Mark Weiger, chairman of the EMU Budget Committee, asked IFC members to reconsider the EMU's 1990-91 budget

request of a 7 percent increase. IFC members voted 4-1 to leave the budget at \$591,461.

In another appeal, Club sports asked the committee for \$30,000 to enlarge its office space. Organization supporters complained the current office is too small to house the number of people using it.

Club Sports had requested the same amount at an April 16 IFC meeting, but members were told to put the request on the student body elections ballot.

According to a memo from the Club Sports Executive Committee, the ASUO Constitution

Court told Club Sports April 20 that they had missed the April 4 deadline for ballot measures.

The IFC voted 4-0-1 to deny the new request.

In other IFC business:
• The committee voted 3-2 to cut the Philosophy Club budget from \$1,850 to \$731. The ASUO executive office vetoed the larger amount approved by the IFC at an earlier meeting.

• The budget for the Amazon Community Tenants Association was cut from \$3,430 to \$2,593 for next year. IFC members voted unanimously to reduce the larger allocation, which had been vetoed by the ASUO.

• The Sister University Project budget was restructured but not changed in amount.
