# Peace educator to lecture

Peace studies and the future of universities will be the focus of a free public talk tonight by Betty Reardon, an international authority on peace studies.

Reardon's talk begins at 7:30 p.m. in Room 100 Willamette, and a reception will follow at the Collier House.

Reardon is the fourth internationally regarded figure to present classes and public lectures through the University's Carlton and Wilberta Ripley Savage Visiting Chair in International Relations and Peace.

"Reardon is one of the world's foremost peace educators," said Cheyney Ryan, director of the peace studies program.

"Oregonians take peace issues more and more seriously, regardless of their political viewpoint," Ryan said. "We are delighted that people in Eugene ... have the chance to hear Reardon's views firsthand."

Reardon is teaching courses on international studies and peace education for the College of Education this spring.

Reardon is a professor and director of the Peace Education Program at Columbia University's Teachers College. She also directs the Peacemaking in Education Program of United Ministries in Education, a group of Christian denominations working on education issues.

Reardon has written more than 100 works on peace education, human rights education and global problems.

She has served on a number of advisory boards and councils, notably the University for Peace Council (appointed by the Secretary General of the United Nations), the U.N. Non-governmental Organization's Committee on Disarmament, and the Pan American Council for Peace Research and Education.

# Free measles shots offered

The Student Health Center is offering free measles shots for those students who received immune globulin shots in January.

When the measles scare broke out in late February, Jackson recommended that students who received shots for the hepatitis incident not get a measles shot because the globulin vaccine also prevents measles.

However, the globulin shots will begin wearing off, and those students who received the shot should get a measles vaccine, he said Monday.

Students can receive free measles boosters at the health center for the next two weeks from 1 to 4 p.m.

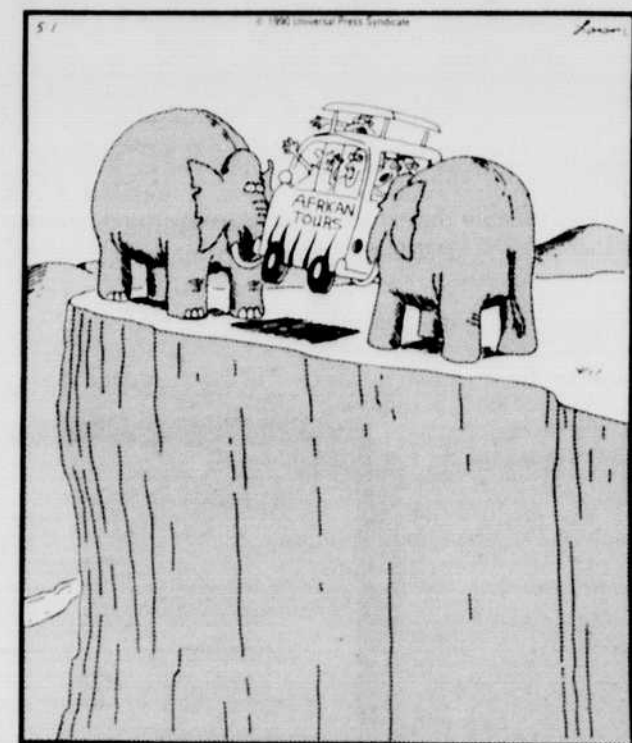
