

Ducks, Devils split doubleheader

Pitching dominated both games of Monday's doubleheader between Arizona State and Oregon as the two teams managed only four runs between them.

In the opener, Oregon's Katie Wiese went the distance as the Ducks came back from a 1-0 deficit in the bottom of the ninth to post a 2-1 victory. The Sun Devils won game two 1-0 as Dawn Wood threw a four-hit shutout. With the split, Oregon is now 3-9 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 26-20 overall. Arizona State is now 9-9 and 41-29, respectively.

After Arizona State went ahead in the top of the ninth in the first game, Oregon scratched out three hits and scored two runs with two outs for the win.

With Jeanna King on base, Kim Manning hit a run-scoring

single to score King and then came home when Tracey Simmons hit a game-winning RBI-single.

The Ducks had only four hits in the game with King getting two, but Oregon head coach Tami Brown was confident the Ducks could pull the game out.

"I wasn't worried, even when we had two outs," she said. "We won a great game and I'm proud of the kids. Katie did a good job on the mound."

Wiese allowed eight hits, but didn't walk a batter in improving to 18-10 on the season.

In game two, Oregon again had a tough time at the plate, squeaking out four singles. The Sun Devils were held to only two hits by the Ducks' Anna Poore, but Arizona State was able to edge across a run in the top of the first inning to win

1-0.

Monday's doubleheader was originally scheduled for Saturday, but was moved back because of last week's rain which left Howe Field in less than ideal shape. Monday's twin bill was the Ducks' first action in more than a week and Brown said the layoff hurt her team.

"I think it had an affect on us," she said. "We've been on the field, but we haven't been playing."

The Ducks won't get much of a break this week as they host Portland State Wednesday, Oregon State Thursday and then California on Friday.

Brown said she is looking forward to playing six games in only three days.

"We need some games," she said. "We are so far from being worn out. We've had too many gaps between games."
