

Soccer team remains undefeated

Club Lacrosse

The Oregon Club Lacrosse team came back from a 9-3 loss to Old West in the opening round of Pacific Northwest Lacrosse tournament last weekend to post a 2-2 tourney record.

After the opening loss, the Ducks beat Multnomah Men's Club and Puget Sound, both by blowout. The Ducks then lost to the University of Washington 8-3 in the semifinals of the 'B' bracket (for first-round losers) Sunday.

The men host Oregon State Sunday at noon at the University's IM fields.

Track teams get five to sign for next year

The Oregon track teams have recently signed five athletes to letters-of-intent for next season with the men's team signing three and the women's team two.

The Duck men have added sprinter Lavon Pierce from Portland's Benson High School and distance runners Coley Candaele of Carpinteria High School in Southern California and Andy Maris of White River High School in Buckley, Wash.

Pierce is the top sprinter in the state this season at the Class AAA level, posting the fastest times in the 100 meters (10.6), 200 meters (21.8) and the 400 meters (48.26). Pierce also is a member of the Techmen's state-leading 400-meter relay team (42.0).

Pierce will be counted on heavily next season as the Ducks lose their top sprinter, Davon Russell, to graduation.

Candaele is the nephew of Houston Astro infielder Casey Candaele and his father Rick is the head coach of the UC-Santa Barbara football team.

Candaele has a personal record of 4:09.1 in the 1,600 meters and has also run the 800 meters in 1:51.11. He currently is the national high school leader in the 800 with a time of 1:51.18.

A multi-talented athlete, Candaele also played quarterback for Carpinteria High School and was the Division IX player of the year for foot-

ball in California.

Maris is also another outstanding distance runner. He won the Washington Class AA cross country titles in both his junior and senior seasons. He has a 4:10.7 PR in the 1,600 and has run the 3,200 in a best of 8:53.78. Maris boasts the top 3,200 time in the nation this year.

Meanwhile, Oregon women's coach Tom Heinonen announced two letter-of-intent signings last week.

Julie Beck, the defending Wisconsin state champ in both the shot put and the discus, and Amo Olson, a high jumper from Class AA Douglas High School in Dillard, have signed with the Ducks.

Beck has a PR of 46-11½ in the shot and 150-7 in the discus at Tomah High School and will be a key addition for Oregon next season as Stephanie Smith, its top thrower in both events, will graduate.

With the signing of Olson, the Ducks will have a lot of depth in the high jump as Olson joins sophomore Laurel Roberts, an NCAA provisional qualifier this season, and Kelly Blair in the event.

Olson placed second at last year's state meet with a leap of 5-6 and has gone as high as 5-7 this season. However, the 6-0 Olson scaled 5-10 at the Eugene Indoor in February to break Roberts' meet record.
