ing the Willamette Greenway and adapting city programs to meet needs of families, youths, seniors, women and minorities.

Robinette advocates the proposed Riverfront Research Park and a strong University as essential parts of the local economy.

In addition, he believes that to ensure economic health through wage-paying jobs, "we must not make decisions that restrict the availability of such jobs."

Moniz is a counselor with the Sacred Heart Adolescent Recovery Program, and he seeks to broaden the representation of leadership on the city council.

In addition, Moniz said he would like to see a stabilized local economy, supported by environmentally sound businesses. Another goal would be supporting AAA baseball and World Hockey League teams, as well as bringing the 1992 Olympic trials to Eugene, he said.

In Ward 6, which comprises the Bethel-Danebo area, incumbent and University student Bobby Green is running against

accountant Darrell Grundman.

Green was appointed to the council in early 1989 and is a member of several committees, including the Human Rights Task Force, the Joint Social Service Fund Committee and the Community Coalition for the Prevention of Youth Gangs.

Green's main focuses will include public safety, responsible community development and productive alternatives for local

youth.

Grundman brings experience in programs such as the Eugene Chamber of Commerce and the Joint Committee on Economic Diversification.

His goals concern accommodating the expansion of the Bethel-Danebo area, particularly in areas including traffic, housing development and neighborhood improvement.


