Business school marks 75th with appointments

The University's College of Business - Administration marked its 75th anniversary Tuesday by announcing the appointment of nine University business faculty members to positions worth more than \$4 million.

by private gifts and the state's new endowment match pro-

The positions help compensate for the gap between University base salaries and the national average, said James Reinmuth, business dean and University interim vice president for public affairs and de-

velopment

"These appointments make it possible for us to keep many of the nation's top business scholars in the state," Reinmuth said.

Reinmuth said the University's business school has a total of seven named professorships and four funded research scholar positions. All have been awarded to current members of the business faculty.

"The professor award provides a 25 percent increase over the base salary and the research scholar award pays an additional 15 percent over the base salary." Reinmuth said.


Holders of the new distinguished professorships are:

- Larry Dann, named to the Dean's Professorship in Finance. Dann, who heads the Department of Finance, specializes in corporate financial policy. His research focuses on the effect of management policies designed to thwart takeover attempts on the welfare of the firm's common stockholders.
- Richard Mowday, named to the Gerald B. Bashaw Professorship in Management. Mowday's research and consulting activities focus on employee commitment, turnover and absenteeism, the early employment period, and employee reactions to work in organizations.
- Richard Steers, named to the Kazumitsu Shiomi Distinguished Professorship in International Management. Steer's research compares management and motivational techniques in Asia and the United States.
- James Terborg, named to the

Carolyn S. Chambers Professorship in Management. Terborg studies health promotion programs in the workplace, employee motivation, and individual and group indices of organizational effectiveness.

Recipients of research scholar awards are:

- Robert Clemen, associate professor of decision sciences, is the new Robert C. Braddock Research Scholar. He studies consensus, and many of his publications deal with mathematical models for combining information from a variety of expert sources.
- Sergio Koreisha, associate professor of decision sciences, is the new Charles Lundquist Research Scholar. He specializes in forecasting, mathematical model building and related fields.
- Wayne Mikkelson, associate professor of finance, is the Roger Engemann Research Scholar. He studies corporate financial policy and corporate acquisitions.
- Gerardo Ungson, associate professor of management and director of the International Business Program, is the new College of Business Administration Research Scholar, His research interests include strategic decision-making, strategic implementation and global strategies.


