Seahawks sign Loville

The Seattle Seahawks have signed former University running back Derek Loville as a free agent, the National Football League team announced

Wednesday.

Loville becomes the fifth University player signed to an NFL free-agent contract this season, joining safety Derek Horton and receiver Terry Obee (both to the Seahawks), offensive lineman Chris Husko (Detroit Lions) and tight end Joe Meerten (Atlanta Falcons).

Running back Latin Berry, offensive lineman Curt Dykes, and defensive backs Chris Oldham and Daryl Reed were selected in the NFL draft in March, bringing to nine the number of University players entering the NFL this season.

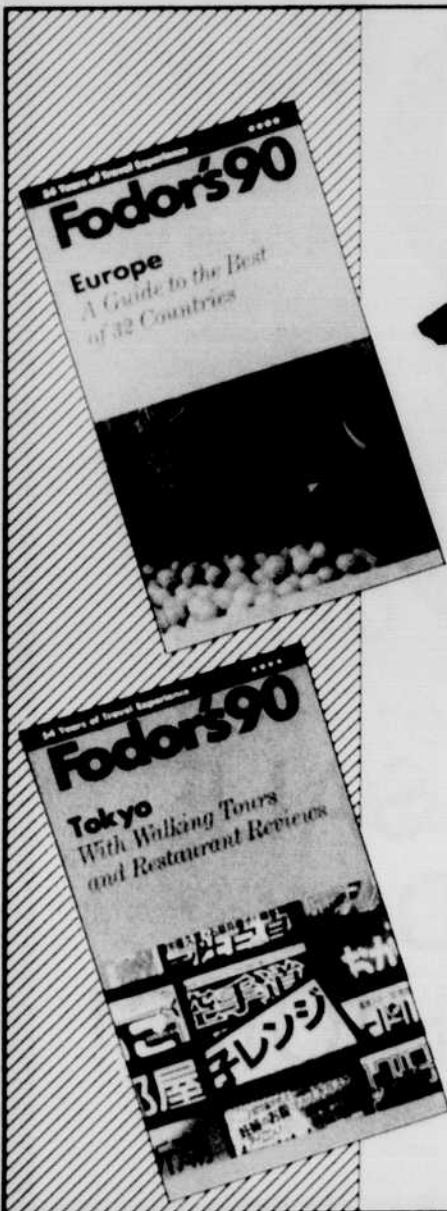
The 5-foot-9, 198-pound Loville finished his career as Oregon's all-time leading rusher and scorer. His 3,296 rushing yards and 272 points in four years with the Ducks broke records set by Bobby Moore (now Ahmad Rashad).

Loville started slowly for Oregon in his senior year but came on strong as the season progressed to finish as the leading rusher for the 1989 Independence Bowl champion Ducks. In 12 games Loville finished with 959 net yards on 244 carries for a 3.9 yards-per-carry average.

The 22-year-old Loville is the holder of numerous other school records, including career rushing attempts (814), most rushing attempts in a season (265 in 1988) and most points in a game (24 vs. Idaho State in 1988).

A native of San Francisco, Loville came to the University after being selected city player of the year and being named to the all-Bay area team.

The Seahawks will be looking for help at tailback now that the club's leading rusher, Curt Warner, has signed with the Los Angeles Rams as a Plan B free agent.
