The biggest question mark is what will happen with those Oregon tracksters who are NCAA provi sional qualifiers. The NCAA set both automatic and provisional standards this season to allow events with few automatic qualifiers to be competitive with additional entries.

However, it won't be known until just before the accepted
Five Oregon thinclads have met NCA1 provisional standards, including Hudson in the 5.000 meters. pole vaulter Brian Cullen, Latin Berry in the long ump. Spencer Williams in the triple jump and Pat Haller in the 10.000 . Hudson (5.000), Cullen. Berry (long jump and triple jump) and Williams were all NCAA qualifiers last season

Oregon should be able to benefit from Saturday s competition to add to their list of both NCAA and Pa cific-10 Conference qualifiers as the Twilight Meet anoually draws some of the top track talent in the coun

Hayward Field record holders Brian Crouser (jave (in) and Lance Deal (hammer) indicated after the Oregon Invitational that they would return to Hayward Field for Saturday's meet. Alberto Salazar, who began his comeback in the 10.000 at the Oregon Invitational
also hinted afterwards that he would run the 5.000 at


Dellinger said he hopes for about 15 NCAA qualifiers and will be hoping that Williams and Berry can move onto the automatic qualifying list

Williams, bothered by a sore groin all season. competed in the triple jump in last Saturday's dual meet against Nebraska and had a winning wind-aided leap of $53-1 \frac{1}{2}$, just off the NCAA automatic standard
of $53-33$.
More importantly for Williams, though, is that he needs a Pac-10 qualifving mark of $24-31 / 2$ in the long ump Saturday if he is to compete in that event at the Pac 10 meet May 19 -20 in Seatle

Berry has made the NCAA provisional list in the long jump with a best this season of 25-714 , but needs iump of 26 - 1 or better to qualify automatically

Beset by a bruised heel and the National Footbal tague draft. Berry has only gone $51-10^{1 / 2}$ in the triple fump this season after qualifying for the NCAA meet in that event the previous three seasons.

Three other Ducks are also shooting for NCAA auromatic qualifying spots sons ago. has had his best and most consistent season fime-wise, and should go below the automatic standard of 3.42 .20 if the race is aided by a rabbit pace The 1.500 will be run instead of the traditional Twi ight Mile for the second year in a row in hopes of

Brian Wright. who qualified in the 400 -meter hur dles a year ago, is looking for a return trip this year. Wright has run 51.15 this season while the automatic standard is 50.75

Cullen set a PR of 17-7 earlier this season. but the NCAA automatic standard has been raised from 17-6¹4 to $18-0 \frac{1}{2}$ this season. Cullen had his best outing in over a month last Saturday, clearing 16-10 ${ }^{\frac{1}{4}}$ on his first attempt and just missing at $17-4$

Despite the season quickly winding down, Dellin ger doesn't believe there is any pressure on people to meet the qualifying marks.
"If there is any pressure, it comes from within" he said. "because I don't believe in putting pressure on them other than going out and competing and doing their best
Sprinter Klaus Weigeldt, who has missed most of the season because of a hamstring injury, will run the 400 meters in an attempt to meet the Pac-10 standard f 4784 Last vear Weigeldt had a best of 46.47 and finished fourth at the conference meet.

Lopez, who ran a collegiate-leading 8:28.44 in the steeplechase last Saturday, will go for a Pac-10 qualifying time of $1: 51.44$ in the 800 meters. The Ducks already have three conference qualifiers in that event.
