

"The testing is inadequate to uncover known toxic waste sites and does not include all known sites." Wolfe said.

Williams said he is disappointed Wolfe chose to publicize this new information by calling a press conference instead of first coming to the Uni-

"It calls into question their motive," Williams said. "If the way we're doing business is not satisfactory to someone's political agenda, that's not my problem.


Wolfe, however, said he did approach a "high level" University official with the material for informal talks but was turned down
