"The testing is inadequate to uncover known toxic waste sites and does not include all known sites," Wolfe said.

Williams said he is disappointed Wolfe chose to publicize this new information by calling a press conference instead of first coming to the University.

"It calls into question their motive," Williams said. "If the way we're doing business is not satisfactory to someone's political agenda, that's not my problem."


Wolfe, however, said he did approach a "high level" University official with the material for informal talks but was turned down.

The University and L.R.

Squier based the study's strategy on information from former Physical Plant employees who were involved in disposing wastes from the sciences departments.

Tom Hicks, associate director for environmental health and safety, said the University would look into Gerralt's story and present the information to L.R. Squier for analysis.


