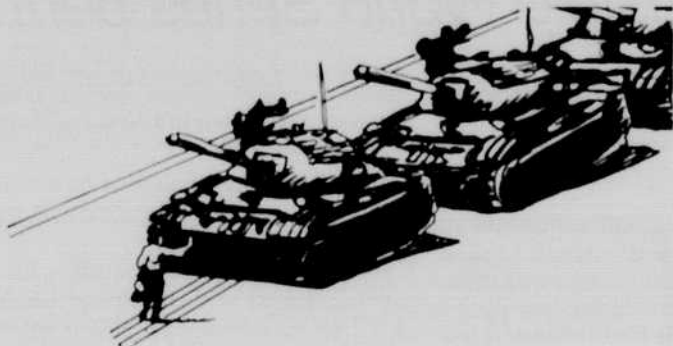

Weigeldt returns to Hayward

Back after month off

Sprinter Klaus Weigeldt may have seemed like a forgotten man this season, but at Saturday's Oregon Twilight Meet the West German native showed he can still run fast.

Weigeldt hadn't run an individual race since a dual meet with Washington April 7, and hadn't run any type of race since reinjuring a hamstring in the 400-meter relay at the Pepsi Team Invitational.

But with time running out before next weekend's Pacific-10 Conference Championships, Weigeldt returned to the Hayward Field track and won the 400 meters easily Saturday with a meet-record time of 46.88, beating the Pac-10 qualifying standard of 47.84.

"I felt kind of nervous," Weigeldt admitted. "It was strange to run after being out so long. I think it will be much easier next week."

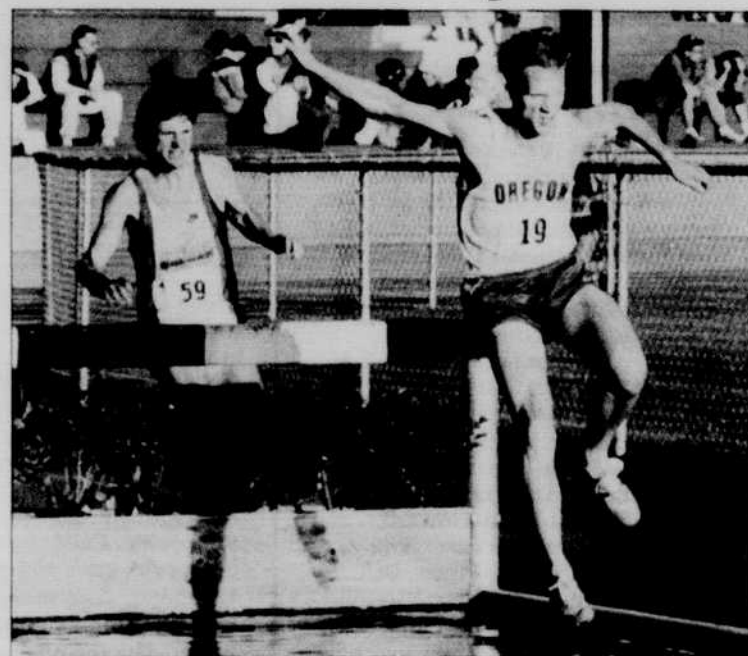

Tye Van Schoiack set a PR and qualified for the Pac-10 Conference meet in the steeplechase with a time of 8:54.41 during Saturday's Oregon Twilight Meet at Hayward Field.

"I went out fast and I was just hoping it wasn't too fast," he said. "I wanted to go for the Pac-10 mark and I thought it would be kind of close. I thought anything under 47 (seconds) would be great."

Ironically, the meet record Weigeldt broke was a 46.8 hand-timed clocking turned in by former Duck George Walcott, now Oregon's sprint coach.

"Basically my only concern was that he finish OK," Walcott said. "There was no doubt that he would run sub-47. He can run that (the Pac-10 qualifying time) backward."

Not only has Oregon been hampered in the sprints without Weigeldt this season, its relay teams, where Weigeldt runs the anchor leg on both, have

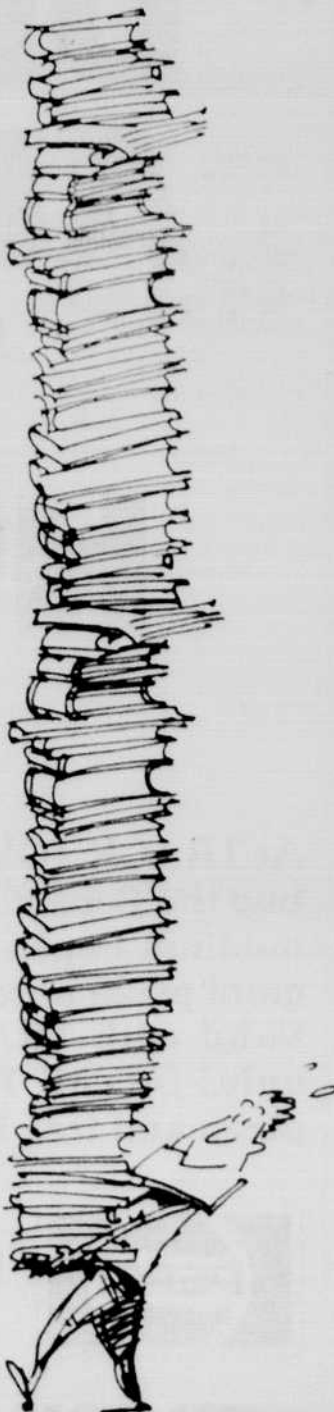
