The University Club Lacrosse team had a rough time last weekend, losing a pair of games on their Washington road trip.

The University of Washington beat the Ducks 10-5 Friday at Seattle's Husky Stadium and Western Washington edged Oregon 8-6 in Bellingham Saturday.

Jesse Padfield, Pete Adamson, John O'Dea, Kyle Kotchek and Rob Haggerty each had single goals for Oregon while Rob English added two assists in the loss to the Huskies.

Club Lacrosse will host Lewis and Clark at Southbank Field this Saturday at 1 p.m. The men's record stands at 9-4.

DaSilva takes easy lead in multi-event

Oregon's Pedro daSilva took the first-day lead in the Pacific-10 Conference decathlon Monday in Seattle while the Ducks' Kamala Kohlmeier is second after the first day of the heptathlon.

DaSilva, who finished second in last year's Pac-10 decathlon, scored 4,164 points in the first five events to take a commanding lead over Washington State's Rodney Zuyderwyk who scored 3,899 points.

Also in the decathlon, Oregon's Mike Leonesio was sixth after the first day with 3,662 points.

Kohlmeier, who set her personal record of 5,066 points in the Oregon Invitational, had 3,091 points after the first day's events. Kohlmeier is shooting for the NCAA automatic qualifying standard of 5,280 points.

Kelly Blair is also competing in the heptathlon for the Ducks and stands in third place with 2,976 after the first four events.

DaSilva won the shot put with a toss of 51-7% and the high jump with a leap of 6-8% to pace his first-day point total while finishing in the top four in the other three opening-day

events

Leonesio started slowly in the decathlon, but came on strong at the end of the day, winning the 400 meters in 49.03 to accumulate his biggest one-point event total.

The final five events of the decathlon — the discus, javelin, pole vault, 110-meter hurdles and the 1.500 — will be held today.

In the heptathlon, Kohlmeier won the 100-meter hurdles in 14.44 and the 200 meters in 25.94 while finishing second in the shot put. Stanford's Peggy Odita is the first-day heptathlon leader with 3,134 points.

Blair didn't have a spectacular day Monday, but was consistent and solid enough to finish third. She was third in the high jump with a leap of 5-534 and a seasonal-best 14-84 in the 100 hurdles.

Six scoring places are at stake in the mulit-event competition with scoring done on a 10-8-6-4-2-1 scale for the team races.

The heptathlon will also wind-up competition today with the long jump, javelin and 800 meters slated.
