## University Day to help campus appearance


"We want people to break from their groups and meet people they normally wouldn't have contact with." Untalan said

The ice cream social will be held from 5 to 7 p.m. on the EMU East Lawn. The Blubinos will play in the Ballroom at 7. Both events are free for those who are participate in University Day.
