DaSilva tops Pac-10 decathlon with 7,754

As expected, Oregon's Pedro daSilva won the Pacific-10 Conference decathlon Tuesday while Ducks Kelly Blair and Kamala Kohlmeier finished second and third, respectively, in the heptathlon.

DaSilva finished with 7,754 points to easily win over Arizona's Thomas Stevens, who had 7,327 points. Oregon's Mike Leonesio added a fifth place performance in the decathlon for the Ducks.

In the heptathlon, Blair scored 5.042 points while Kohlmeier had 5.013 points. It was Blair's top mark of the season.

Blair also overtook Kohlmeier on the second day of the competition. Kohlmeier was in second place after Monday's competition, but Blair had better marks in all three of Tuesday's events.

DaSilva finished second in last year's Pac-10 decathlon but was expected to win easily this year after Arizona's Derek Huff, last year's winner, graduated.

DaSilva had 4,164 points after the first day, but did not have a spectacular second day. He did win the discus with a toss of 150-2, his best mark of the season, but ran the 110-meter hurdles in only 15.04, far off his seasonal-best of 14.17.

In the heptathlon, Blair won the javelin with a toss of 122-6 and finished in the top four in the long jump and the 800 meters.

Kohlmeier, who injured an ankle on May 5 in a dual meet against Nebraska, struggled from the start Tuesday, going only 17-11¼ in the long jump and then finishing fourth in the javelin and fifth in the 800.

Stanford's Peggy Odita, the first-day leader in the heptathlon, won the competition with 5,285 points.

The performances of daSilva and Leonesio give Oregon 12 team points to take the team lead heading into Saturday and Sunday's individual competition. Scoring is done on a 10-8-6-4-2-1 basis.

The Oregon women also stand in first place in the team competition after the heptathlon with 14 points based on Blair and Kohlmeier's performances.
