Exchange program information offered

Students both with and without disabilities can learn opportunities to travel overseas and participate in exchange programs by attending a brown bag presentation today at noon.

Jean Marchant, board member of Mobility International U.S.A., will discuss the services offered by MIUSA and how students can get involved in international educational exchange programs.

MIUSA is a non-profit organization that is partially funded by the United States Information Agency. Its office is located in Eugene.

MIUSA specializes in arranging international exchanges for students with disabilities, but also places nondisabled students.

The organization has successfully arranged exchange programs in China, Germany, England, Italy and Costa Rica, and has also published a number of resource books.

The University recently became a member of MIUSA, which means that any student

may use its services without paying a fee, said Kelli Steele, student intern at the Office of International Services.

"We want to create more opportunities for disabled people to travel overseas," Steele said. "We want to create an awareness of these opportunities on campus for students with disabilities and able-bodied students."

The presentation, which is co-sponsored by the Office of International Services and Disabled Student Services, will take place at noon in EMU Cedar rooms C and D.
