### Freshmen win honors

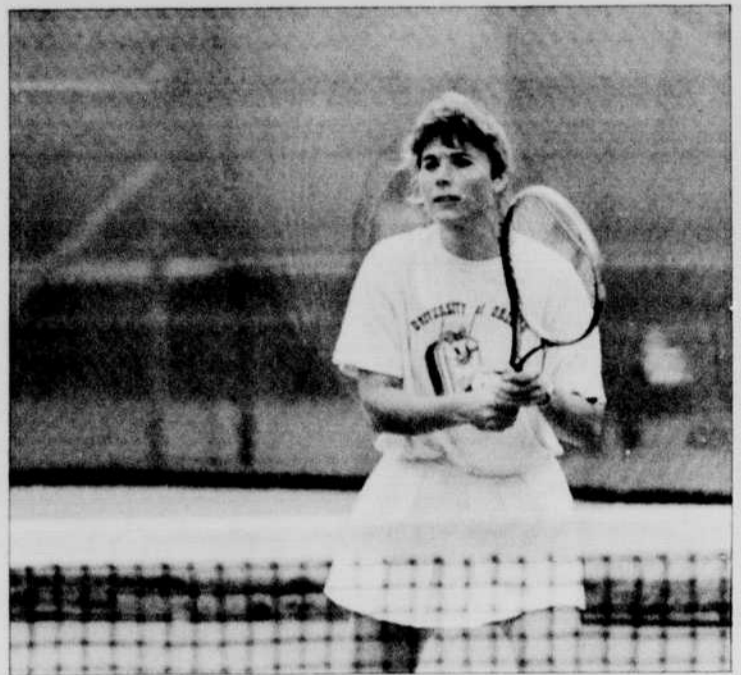
Senior Amber Goheen was voted the Oregon women's tennis team's most valuable player for the 1990 season, coach Tom Greider announced last week.

The Battleground, Wash., native had a singles record of 17-12 as the team's No. 3 singles player and teamed with senior Kumi Nagamoto to play the team's top doubles position.

Goheen finished her career as the fifth-leading singles player for Oregon with 56 wins and is among the leaders in doubles wins, as well.

Two freshmen, Tracey Miller and Shelley Brandt, picked up the Most Inspirational and Most Improved Awards, respectively. Miller was 4-4 in singles and went 10-6 in doubles. Brandt had a 13-13 singles ledger and a 17-8 doubles mark to lead the team.
