Clearcuts confirmed

called for a congressional investigation after discovering a second case of logging in the Three Sisters Wilderness east of Eugene

Willamette National Forest officials confirmed that about seven acres of wilderness were inadvertently logged in 1985 near Rainbow Falls, southeast of McKenzie Bridge.

They said the area was clearcut because new wilderness boundary information somehow was not passed along to the ranger district's timber sale planners when the trees were sold and logged

Environmentalists said they believe the U.S. Forest Service knew about the new boundary and deliberately allowed logging to take place inside the wilderness.

McKenzie Ranger District

was the ranger when the disputed logging occurred, said the accusation that Forest Service employees deliberately allowed logging in the wilderness is "demeaning to a lot of Forest Service people.

"The Forest Service is an agency comprised of people who are committed to doing their best in the face of a lot of conflicting advice, legislation that isn't always clear, and budgets that may not be what they should be." Dunbar said.

The Citizens Task Force on Timber Sale Review, a group that has been reviewing timber sales in the vicinity of the Three Sisters Wilderness, last month discovered that about 12 acres of wilderness several miles to the south of the 1985 logging had been clear-cut in the mid-1980s.
