#### Stadium to open for camping at June Grateful Dead shows

The Grateful Dead concerts scheduled at Autzen Stadium will allow camping for concert patrons. The June 23 and 24 shows and the band's Sacramento date will be the only sites on the 1990 tour that will allow camping.

Camping area will open at noon on Friday, June 22. Campers are encouraged to arrive by 8 a.m. on June 23 to ensure a camping spot. The area will close at 10 p.m. on Monday, June 25.

The charge for camping is \$20 per vehicle and will be open only to campers holding tickets to both concerts only. There will be no in/out privileges for campers. If vehicles leave campground, no reentry will be permitted without paying the camping fee again.

Entry to the camping area will be through entry number four at the East entrance to Autzen Stadium parking lot off Centennial Boulevard.
