

Miller added that he would like to be able to provide the people in the Homeless Employment program with some of the same services that are offered to people in Goodwill's job training program, but Goodwill does not have the funding to do so

'We would like to offer more services like job placement and sociological counseling." Miller said. He added that the other services are needed because it can be a big adjustment for homeless people just to be at work everyday by 8 a.m.

"It can also be difficult for people who have been their own bosses for years to take orders from someone else." he said.


Funding for the program comes from Goodwill's regular payroll operating expenses. That budget comes from the sale of clothing and other donated goods and from Goodwill's wood products shop.


There is not a lot of funding for this (program)." Mclaughlin said. "We had a mailing recently and some of the public was generous and sent in donations and that helped a lot.

Miller said the employment program was designed to help meet the needs of particular individuals who fall through the cracks. Homeless people have trouble getting plugged into the help organizations, he added.

If you have no address you can't get welfare, you're not eligible for food stamps and you can't get an I.D. or a driver's license." Miller added.

This program helps the problem but it does not solve Mclaughlin said. "Housing it. in Eugene is still real expen sive


