

Four department positions filled

Open faculty positions in three departments have been filled. University Provost Norman Wessells said this week.

Steadman Upham, currently associate graduate dean at New Mexico State University, succeeds Kenneth Ramsing as dean of the University Graduate School.

Lorraine Davis, head of the health education program in the University's School and Community Health, has been appointed vice provost for academic personnel.

Gary Martin, associate dean of the School of Music, has agreed to serve as the school's acting dean until the position is filled permanently, and associate professor Ed Kammerer has accepted a one-year appointment as associate dean of the music school.

All four will assume their new positions this summer.

In her new post, Davis, a University faculty member since 1972, will work on personnel issues such as tenure, promotion, appointment policies, affirma-

tive action, and sabbatical and retirement programs.

As dean of the graduate school, Upham will serve as the school's chief administrative officer and will be the University's chief liaison with the Graduate Teaching Fellows Federation.

Upham will be responsible for designing and executing a review process for all graduate degree programs and may help develop cooperative graduate degree programs with other state universities.

As acting dean of the music school, Martin will fill in for Bernard Dobroski, who is leaving in August to become dean of Northwestern University's music school.

He said that a nationwide search has been launched for a permanent replacement for Dobroski.

Martin earned his doctorate at the University, and joined the music school faculty in 1966.

Kammerer, who will serve as associate dean during the search, joined the University faculty in 1970. "Ed Kammerer will bring considerable expertise and knowledge of the School of Music" to his new job, Martin said.


