

Memorial to be held

A memorial service for Nancy Parker, a University graduate and EMU employee who died July 9, will be held Thursday night at 7 at McKenzie Flying Service, 90600 Greenhill Road.

Parker, a flight instructor for McKenzie, was killed when the plane she was piloting crashed at a summer flying camp in Tuskegee, Ala. Parker worked summers at the camp teaching piloting skills to disadvantaged high school students.

In the meantime construction of an access road to the Silva Orchards area on the east end of the park should start the beginning of August, Wiley said.

She said Silva is a clean site and any problems that may arise in other areas of the park would not effect development there.

The proposed 67 acre research park has come under fire after the University announced that chemicals from its laboratories were dumped there 20 years ago.

The research park is a combined project of the University, the City of Eugene and Institutional Development Associates, a Salt Lake City firm.

The fourth and last of the assessment reports will be done later this summer, Wiley said.

committed to going to school," he said. "But a lot of times they'll pay their tuition and not be able to buy groceries for the month."

Bailey's concerns were echoed by William Corey, former student body president of graduate and professional students at OSU. Corey said that many graduate students are

people returning to school to acquire skills that will help them survive in today's more competitive job market. The tuition increases will hurt those students, and ultimately the economy of the state, Corey said.

Bailey said there was a "strong showing" at the meeting, adding that although the board has probably already made up its mind to raise tuition, the group made its point

"I think the hearings officer went away knowing we don't want higher tuition," he said.

Stubbart said he was impressed by the students' presentations.

"This has been the most testimony I've heard at a public hearing in several years," Stubbart said. "I'm going to do the best I can to convey the intensity of the feelings about these issues. I'm positive there will be some discussion by the board about the decision."

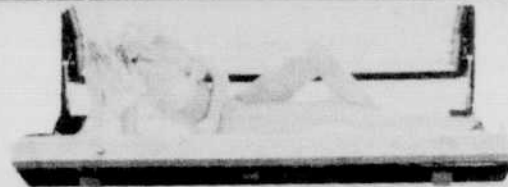
