# Man caught riding stolen bicycle

The following is a list of campus-area crimes reported to the Office of Public Safety and the Eugene Police Department between July 13 and Aug. 1:

- Two men were stopped by an EPD officer at the corner of 15th Avenue and Kincaid Street Aug. 1 after they were observed acting suspiciously around two campus-area bike racks.

- Unknown suspects removed the antenna and damaged the bumper of a car parked at the Bean Complex parking lot July 17, causing \$500 in damage.
- Three photocopied \$1 bills were found in the change machine of the Knight Library July 19, resulting in the loss of an equal amount in quarters.
- Two male subjects were seen jumping up and down on the roof and hood of a Campus Security vehicle parked at the corner of 13th Avenue and High Street. The men, who left the scene without being apprehended, caused \$400 in damage to the car.
- A checkbook and a baseball bat and glove were stolen from a vehicle parked at apartments at 1544 Alder St., a total loss of \$132. The driver of the car had left his door unlocked.
- A resident of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity, 1472 Kincaid St., left nine pairs of athletic shoes in his locked room July 8, and returned July 24 to find them stolen. The shoes were valued at \$725.
- In addition, OPS reports 12 bikes stolen, and one additional bike reported.

One of the men was riding a bicycle that a University student had reported stolen July 31, and was taken into custody for failure to appear in court on a theft charge. The officer confiscated a pair of bolt cutters from the other man. The bicycle, a \$400 Trek mountain bike, was returned to its owner Aug. 1.

- A car amplifier and two speakers were stolen from a convertible parked at apartments at 1750 Alder St. on July 15, a total loss of \$400. The driver had parked the car with the top down.
- A bike seat and carrier rack worth a total of \$80 were stolen from a bike parked at the education

# Earth First! blamed for \$2,000 in damages

PORTERVILLE, Calif. (AP) — Sequoia National Forest officials contend that Earth First! demonstrators caused about \$2,000 damage by vandalizing a logging road and equipment during Monday's "Redwood Summer" protest.

A citation charging violations of terms of a permit was issued against one protest leader, Mark Huntington of San Francisco, and others will be cited, said ranger Del Pengilley.

In addition, a \$250 bond accompanying a group camping permit issued to Brian Eckert of Springfield may be forfeited on grounds that demonstrators violated permit language that bars vandalism, said Lee Belau, fire management officer.

Eckert said he could not be held responsible for the actions of the more than 100 demonstrators who hiked down a remote logging trail near Quaking Aspen campground Monday morning.

"As a spokesman and organizer for Redwood Summer, I adhered to a non-violent and peaceful code," Eckert said.

Vandalism included letting the air out of six tires on a Caterpillar tractor. A thick cable was wrapped around one piece of machinery, and one end of the cable was stuck inside the engine compartment.

Other demonstrators rolled logs and boulders onto the logging road at various spots along the trail.
