ers about management, the hiring process, production, and marketing. Kissock said the total time commitment would be about 10 hours.

Van Dusen said that many University students who come to the Volunteer Connection are interested in doing counseling work. Although most students aren't qualified to do one-on-one counseling, opportunities do exist to do related work.

For example, the Rape Crisis Network, which works to support people who have been sexually assaulted, needs volunteers to staff its crisis line. Jerry Stanley, advocate coordinator for the Rape Crisis Network, said that crisis line volunteers are asked to do four shifts per month and to make a year-long commitment. Once volunteers have experience working with the crisis line then they may be able to do peer counseling.

Not all volunteering has to be related to your major. If a student has a few hours free in the afternoons, and wants to get a little exercise, he or she might consider coaching a kids' soccer or flag-football team, or becoming a Big Brother or Big Sister for a child who needs a friend or role model.

Van Dusen said University students comprise about 10 percent of their volunteers and the people at the Volunteer Connection are hoping that number increases this year.
