Saturday nights with no cover charge.

Outdoor seating, adjacent to the restaurant on the terrace, complete with full bar service is also available.

Every night from 4-6 p.m. a happy hour featuring wine and well drinks for \$2 and drafts for \$1.50 with free chips and salsa is available.

Oregon Electric Station, located in a federal and state historical landmark built in 1912, is co-owned by Alberto Salazar and Cordy Jensen. Salazar's record-setting running shoes can be seen as you enter the lobby of the restaurant.

The Main Lounge of Oregon Electric Station is open and airy. The atmosphere is relaxing and comfortable, perfect after a long day.

Guido's, 13th Ave. and Alder Street, features a DJ and dancing Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday nights from 10 p.m.-2 a.m. with no cover charge.

Monday through Friday pitchers of domestic draft beer are \$3.75 from 3-6 p.m. Appetizers are available until closing every night.

Saturday night is Ladies Night, featuring \$1 draft pints and \$1.50 well drinks for women all night long.

Guido's is conveniently located near campus and features a large dance floor surrounded by mirrors and ample tables for seating. A big screen television is also provided. Guido's is great for after class study breaks and dancing on Friday and Saturday nights.

Scandal's Nightclub, 2222 Centennial Blvd between Autzen stadium and Coburg Rd.

Eugene, is located inside the Kowloon Restaurant.

On Thursday and Friday nights, Scandal's features no-cover comedy starting at 9 p.m. Afterwards, dancing is available.

Free roses, food and special drink prices are provided on Saturday, ladies night, at Scandal's. Dancing is featured Tuesday through Saturday.

Monica Clitero, Scandal's employee, said Tuesday is Juke Box Night featuring music from the fifties, sixties and seventies. Hotdogs and draft beers are 65¢ each and well drinks are 75¢ each.

On Thursday and Friday nights plan to arrive early if you want good seats for the comedy shows. The no cover comedy is a popular way to spend an evening in Eugene.

Scandal's is relatively small but still a great place to dance the night away or enjoy a good laugh.

Rustic, loud, and packed are only a few words to describe The Mill Camp Restaurant and Nite Club, 215 Q St., Springfield. Located just off of highway 105, the club features 25 cent draft beer on Monday and Wednesday nights until the taps run dry.

Music is provided by a DJ Monday through Saturday nights. The Mill Camp is closed Sundays. On Tuesday and Thursday nights almost every drink is \$1.50.

The Mill Camp is a great place to party Monday and Wednesday evenings. The dance floor is good-sized and there is plenty of seating available throughout the club. Watch for weekend specials which usually feature 50 cent well drinks until midnight.

Rennie's Landing, 1214 Kincaid Eugene, is located right

across the street from the University Law School. Featuring drafts and great hamburgers, Rennie's is fantastic for lunch or a study break. Rennie's has an outdoor deck for enjoying the sunshine and people-watching from above street level. Video games are available on the first floor.

For inexpensive and stout drinks, The Vets Club located inside the Veterans Memorial Building, 1626 Willamette, is the place to go.

The club features swing and polka dancing for a nice change of pace from usual club rap and pop music.

The Vets Club is nothing fancy and it offers limited open hours, but it is a great place to start an evening.

Jo Federigo's Bar and Cafe, 259 East 5th Ave. Eugene, features live jazz nightly.

The club's specialty is coffee drinks. Monday night provides non-professional musicians with an "open mike" to showcase their talents. The show begins at 9 p.m. and interested musicians can sign up with the bartender.

The upscale atmosphere provides a unique and enjoyable place to relax and listen to great live jazz musicians perform.

De-frisco's Restaurant and Bar, 99 W 10th Eugene, has been open since 1975.

According to club owner Bob Brinkman, they were the first to bring draft imports to the area.

The club features over twenty micro, import and domestic beers on tap along with a full bar. Coffee and blended drinks are the house specialty.

A library atmosphere complete with backgammon tables provides a classy setting to enjoy an espresso, draft, or glass of wine and dessert.
