· Rock climbing, bike trails, the Willamette River and one the best views of the city are found at Skinner Butte Park(8). on the north end of the city. Atop the butte is a spectacular view of downtown Eugene and its surrounding hills. A picturesque rock face on the west side of the butte is ideal for rock climbers, while the trail leading up the butte is a challenge on the way up and a thrill on the way down for cyclists. Bike trails entwine the park, running along the river and north toward Valley River Center

WOW Hall publicist. Mike Walker said the opportunity is open for any place to emerge as the home of the blues; however, the music lends itself to a tavern atmosphere.




Saturday Market

• The Eugene Saturday Market(3), located on the park blocks between Eighth and Oak Streets, hosts food, live entertainment and homemade arts and crafts unique to Eugene every Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Entertainment is provided by local musicians, adding a distinctive flavor to the market. Saturday market will remain open throughout the fall, until the weather becomes too cold.
