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The Recreation Center, complete with pool, pingpong, and foosball tables, can also be found in the basement of the EMU. The center provides bowling, backgammon, chess. and a television for student recreation. Adjacent to the recreation center is an arcade with a variety of video games and pinball machines.

Rideshare, a ride board for student travel from the University to locations within and outside the state, is located next to EMU Suite 1 in the basement. The board provides information for students who wish to car pool with other students for trips home or else-

Valentine's Campus Travel Center, located on the EMU

concourse, is a full service travel agency providing information and ticket services for airline and railway transportation.

The EMU Main Desk serves as a ticket outlet for the Hult Center, WOW Hall, University sponsored events. Cultural Forum events, and local concerts. Tickets for Greyhound and Lane Transit District buses are also available. Discount movie passes for Movieland and Act 3 Cinemas can also be purchased at the Main Desk

Catalyst Films brings a variety of movies at discounted prices to campus each term for University students and the community. The program provides lists during registration of featured films for the upcom-

The EMU also hosts three cafes for student dining. The Fountain Court Cafe and the

Fishbowl are located on the first floor near the main entrance. The Breezeway Cafe features coffee, ice cream, fruits and pastries on the east side of the EMU courtyard across from the Campus Copy Center.

The EMU Skylight Refectory offers a view of campus and a quiet, comfortable place to study. The refectory also features snack foods and bever-

A beer garden and live music are held Friday afternoons from 4 to 7 in the EMU Fountain Court across from the cafe for students 21 and older.

The Waterworks Canoe Company, 1395 Franklin Blvd., is an EMU extension service offering low-cost hourly canoe rentals. The service is provided through fall term for students who wish to float the Millrace and enjoy the campus scenery and wildlife.



All Dogs Go to Heaven * * * *
