Lane County Ice, 796 W. 13th Ave., is the new Eugene ice skating rink that opened last December and now hosts a variety of activities from hockey games to figure skating lessons.

Since then, the new rink has had incredible response.

'It's a big success. I hope it keeps up." said Roger Lloyd, foreman and senior guard.

"I think it's the best thing in Eugene," said 7-year-old Toby Kirklin. "If it wasn't here, I would have to go somewhere

"We have had three times more business than expected," Lloyd said

Only 1.000 yearly passes were expected to be sold, but more than 3,000 had been sold less than a month after the opening.

'It's great. There are too many people and it is too small, but we have prayed for a skating rink for three years.' said Judy Lemay, ice skating

Forty years ago, a local ice rink was built, but it did not generate enough support, Lloyd said. But with the continued immigration of Canadians and East Coast residents to Oregon, many more people wanted to play hockey which caused a need for a rink

"There is a calling now. We are all transplants and all want to play," Lloyd said.

Hockey is becoming a popular sport in Oregon. Lane County Ice has a team called the Eugene All-Stars that competes with teams from Portland, California and Montana

Because of the rink's opening, University student Scott Brown has put together the first University hockey team. He began seeking club sport status
