KRMA staff hopes for winter start-up

Although it has not yet secured a license from the Federal Communications Commission, radio station KRMA continues to progress from conception to reality.

The campus radio station will be broadcasting by winter term, no matter what, said James January, the station's general manager.

Currently, groups of between 10 and 12 people are helping to renovate a building on Agate Street that will become the station's studio.

Two fundraisers have paid for building materials, January said he is hesitant to use any of the \$25,681 in student incidental fees allocated to the station last spring.

"I hope to have the studio and production team in place by the end of fall term," he said.

KRMA hopes to broadcast on a second frequency that KWAX, the existing University radio station, applied for two years ago, but the FCC has been slow to respond. A bid for a frequency costs \$6,000, and time must be allotted for others to bid for the same frequency, but none did, January said.

As for the delay, he said, "Somebody needs to be kicked."

Deregulation during the Reagan years created a rush of applications for more frequencies, slowing the process of getting final confirmation of the station's FCC license, January said.
