Bailey, Stickel sharing presidency

Pair preparing for legislative session, fall term activities

Editor's note: ASUO co-presidents Kirk Bailey and Sheila Stickel have spent their summer preparing for the 1990-91 school year, renegotiating student service contracts, training new executive staff members and getting ready to lobby for better higher education funding in the 1991 legislative session. After being elected as president and vice president in April, Bailey and Stickel announced they would operate their administration as co-presidents, the first time that has been done at the University.

Bailey: I think the whole co-presidents idea is a reflection of both Sheila's and my personal beliefs. There were two people running for office, for the executive office, and I think we both felt that both people needed recognition for what they did and for what they are doing.

Stickel: (After we decided to run and to be co-presidents,) we spent the next three days deciding who was going to run on top of the ticket ... We decided that, going right into the campaign, Kirk had a better understanding of some of the issues ...

wasn't an idea that came up after the campaign.

Bailey: This is an arrangement that Sheila and I have — it's an administrative arrangement within the office. It has nothing to do with the Constitution; there's no prohibition of it. It's simply a technique used to administer an office of 15-plus staff and \$4.5 million worth of incidental fees.
