office in Room 103 Gerlinger.

Starting this Fall, teams will be required to submit roster sheets prior to the start of the season, but players will no longer have to show their student ID cards to "sign-in" before each game. The change is designed to reduce the time between games and keep them on schedule, Rice said.

In addition to leagues, RIM is also offering several one-day events, all free of charge. "Scramble" tournaments for flag football, volleyball, and indoor soccer will be held, giving teams a chance to practice prior to the start of the season. The scrambles also provide training

for the referees, all of whom are students, Rice said. Only between 10 and 20 teams can play in the scrambles, so early sign-up is encouraged.

In addition, a cross country meet and a swim meet are scheduled, with both teams and individuals welcome. The swim meet is a new event this year, and Rice said it is for "anyone who is interested in swimming in a competitive but low-key event."

The first RIM event of the year is a co-ed grass volleyball tournament on Sept. 27, and there is no fee.

The second Annual "Storm the Stairs" run for charity is Nov. 11 at Autzen Stadium. Rice said last year's event raised \$2,900 for the United

States Fidelity & Guaranty National Collegiate Drive to Cure Paralysis, and every dollar raised is matched by the USF&G insurance company.

College campuses nationwide choose their own event to raise money for the program, and Rice said "Storm the Stairs" is unique to Oregon.

"Most campuses have football and volleyball tournaments, but I don't know of anyone who is doing what we're doing," she said.

About 500 students and staff participated last year, climbing a combined 66 vertical miles, Rice said.

Finally, a three-day Tennis Classic is on tap, with both team and individual play. The event is free.



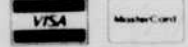
