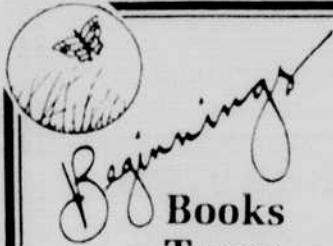

# The good, the bad, the streakers

*Movies filmed on campus have brought money, fame, notoriety*

Film greats such as Jack Nicholson, Jessica Lange, John Belushi and Donald Sutherland have all appeared in movies filmed at the University.

The University is a popular place to film because it offers an Ivy League look within easy travel distance of Los Angeles.

*Drive, He Said*, directed by Jack Nicholson in 1971, was the first movie the University allowed to be filmed on campus.

The University was cautious in granting filming rights for the first time. Its contract with RCA/Columbia stipulated that there could be no nudity, no drug use and no interference with normal campus routines during filming. Also, RCA/Columbia paid \$15,000 to the University's minority programs in return for filming rights.

However, in the chaotic early '70s, the novelty of having film crews on campus competed with student protests for attention, and both caused endless headaches for the University.

Filming did not progress smoothly. One day, two members of the University track team working out in Pioneer Cemetery jogged blithely through a scene being filmed there, without realizing what they had interrupted.

The incident raised the hackles of director Nicholson. "What the hell am I getting?" he grumbled in a 1971 *Emerald* interview. "Extras!"

Nicholson also disregarded many of University's stipulations in the contract. At one point, he encouraged one of his leading actors to run naked
