# ASUO staff takes over

Along with ASUO President Kirk Bailey and Vice-President Sheila Stickel, there are 18 staff members available to help students in a variety of ways. The following is a list of who holds each position and what that job entails.

University Affairs Coordinator **Brian Hoop** works as a liaison to the Student University Relations Council, the Student Senate, Student Athlete Team Council and off-campus living organizations, including Amazon, Westmoreland, Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Council and other neighborhood associations.

In addition, Hoop is a liaison to University groups, the Office of Student Affairs and city, county and other local agencies. He is responsible for committee formation and acting as a special resource for any questions on athletic policy.

**Jennifer Collins**, assistant university affairs coordinator, works with the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group to organize the OXFAM World Hunger Day in the fall and the Residence Hall Governance Committee to help in the completion of their duties. Collins also acts as liaison to various student groups.

**Traci Manning**, state affairs coordinator, and **Tad Rockwell**, assistant state affairs coordinator, organize ASUO lobbying efforts by instructing and coordinating volunteers as student lobbyists and working with the Oregon Student Lobby, United States Student Association, the Oregon State Board of Higher Education and OSPERG.

Events Coordinator **Will White** organizes forums, debates and discussions on University, national or political issues, ASUO symposiums, and plans Fall and Spring Street Faires.

White also works with student groups to facilitate co-sponsorship of campus events and coordinates food distribution for low-income students from federal government surplus and Food for Lane County.

**Bobby Lee**, affirmative action coordinator, works to ensure affirmative action compliance in ASUO programs by monitoring hiring policies, seeing that programs adhere to affirmative action policy and acting as a resource.

Lee is also responsible for reviewing University faculty hiring procedures and making recommendations to the Office of Affirmative Action.

**Carol Cheney**, women's diversity program coordinator, works with various Women's Center programs to further diversification and development.

Programs Coordinator **Killjan Anderson** assists ASUO programs in working with the EMU and University Administrators, including acting as a mediator for ASUO programs.

**Sam Nehm**, finance coordinator, and **Ed Henderson**, assistant finance coordinator, oversee the spending in programs funded by student incidental fees and ensure the programs comply with the policies of the ASUO, the Incidental Fee Committee and the EMU.

The two coordinators, working with the IFC, develop ASUO criteria for student programs to aid in overseeing the budgeting process for the 1991-92 fiscal year, help programs decide on their budget goals and make packets to help groups through the budgeting process.

**Melissa Lundstedt**, media relations coordinator, is the official spokeswoman for the ASUO Executive office. She will work with media organizations on campus and in the community to publicize ASUO events.

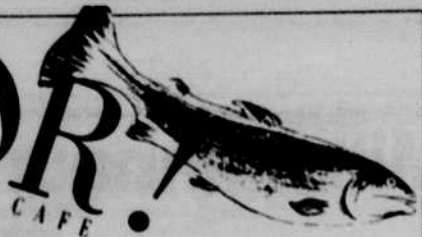

Dedicated to my grandfather Joseph Chester Kime (Kime & Bonebrake, J.C. & E.K., photographers, Akron). He bought his wife Peg (a high school classmate of John S. Knight of Knight Ridder) a Willys Knight (whose namesake W.J. Willy died with Joseph Patrick Kennedy, Jr. in 1944. Joe Jr.'s sister Kick's husband William, Marquess of Hartington also died that year. Kick died in '48.). He died of alcoholism in 1944 (2/2) leaving three children: Joseph, Janet and William (of DePere, WI and salesman for Employers' Insurance of Wausau (dec'd. '86.). (And to Matthew Kime, the youthful 1927 Beggs, OK bank robber)

Also to W.E. Wright (son of Christina Eichenberger) who helped his brother C. Nelson, whose son Richard B. was born 10/16/28, found Wright Tool & Forge Co. in Barberton, OH in 1927 before his death on Nov. 18, 1929. His obituary in the Akron Beacon Journal, a very interesting piece, appeared on page one under the headlines, "Announce Wright Services are to be Held at Home; Rev. Stephen E. Keeler May Come from Chicago to Officiate at Rites; Name C. of C. Committee." The day's overall headline was, "Railroads Speed Up Building" relating to a \$1 billion program. Nelson died Easter Sunday, 1972.
