Coke replaces Pepsi in EMU, dorms

Coca-Cola now flows from the soda fountains in EMU food service areas and in the University Housing Department dining halls after the state awarded Coke a three-year service contract for the University.

When Pepsi's contract to provide beverage syrup to University food services expired at the end of the summer. Coke submitted the lowest bid to the state requisition office in Salem, said EMU food service di-

rector Dennis Carr

The state requisition office negotiates major beverage contracts for all of Oregon's public colleges and universities through a blind price bid process.

Although the change to Coke was originally scheduled to be completed before the start of fall term, delays pushed back the transition to last weekend, Carr said.

The switch affects only foun-

tain drinks; the Fish Bowl, the Fountain Court Cafe and other areas will continue to offer both Coke and Pepsi products in cans.

The EMU Main Desk is excluded from the state's contract and is the only University food service area still offering Pepsi products at its fountain.

Students will be drinking Coke out of paper Pepsi cups until the EMU uses the rest of its cup inventory, Carr said.




