

death threats and have been assaulted.

The report contains many accounts of abuse and discrimination related by people throughout the campus community.

"I was raped by two men in my dorm last year." one surveyed student wrote. "They found out I was a lesbian. I was afraid to report it because I am not out to my folks.

"But the campus police didn't even believe me, so I dropped it." she wrote.

Seeking solutions, the task force recommended applying University and state non-discrimination policies at all levels.

Other recommendations include a permanent administrative office for lesbian and gay concerns, anti-homophobia education and the establishment of a Lesbian and Gay Studies Center.
