he said, citing practicum education, law accreditation, and the Center for Housing Innovation as issues that need to be addressed.

Warnke said that of the \$50 million proposed increase for effective recruitment and retention hiring practices, \$45 million would be used to increase faculty salaries, while the remaining \$5 million would be used for professors' "support

activities," such as computers, research, technical help and resources for conferences.

"If you give a faculty member a salary and don't give them support to go along with it, the faculty member will go somewhere else," Warnke said.

According to Warnke, an average annual salary for a professor in Oregon is \$36,400. Quenzer said if the budget is passed, it would increase salaries by 6 percent. During the past five years, salaries have increased an average of 8 percent a year with the exception of the period July 1, 1988 to Jan. 1, 1989. During that period there was no increase in faculty salaries.

Even though there has been a fairly constant rise in faculty wages, Quenzer said the increase has not kept up with inflation, nor with "what's going on around the country."

death threats and have been assaulted.

The report contains many accounts of abuse and discrimination related by people throughout the campus community.

"I was raped by two men in my dorm last year," one surveyed student wrote. "They found out I was a lesbian. I was afraid to report it because I am not out to my folks."

"But the campus police didn't even believe me, so I dropped it," she wrote.

Seeking solutions, the task force recommended applying University and state non-discrimination policies at all levels.

Other recommendations include a permanent administrative office for lesbian and gay concerns, anti-homophobia education and the establishment of a Lesbian and Gay Studies Center.

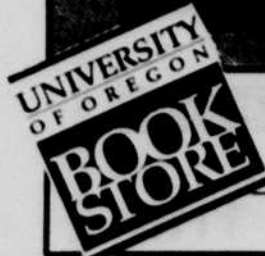
